

Guidelines for organising Students' Week in January 2026

Students' Week is celebrated in a meaningful and comprehensive manner across the State from January 1st to January 7th, by the State Government. In this regard and as planned by the State Education Department different programmes will be observed in all schools, SSKs, MSKs, Colleges, educational institutions, and universities from 1st January to 8th January 2026. Similar celebrations will also take place at the district level.

The week-long initiative aims to enhance holistic learning, lifeskills, 21st-century skills, and promote inclusive education, community engagement fostering rounded development among students. It will focus on raising awareness about various beneficial schemes implemented by the State Government. Key activities include facilitating and mobilizing beneficiaries for the Student Credit Card Scheme, Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship, Aikyashree, and Pre- and Post-Matric Scholarships.

Additionally, the programme will feature the distribution of textbooks, sharing of the *Shubhechcha Barta* from the Hon'ble Chief Minister, and the initiation of activities and policies approved by the School Education Department. A variety of cultural and co-curricular activities, as outlined below, will also form an integral part of the celebrations, emphasizing skill development, creativity, and community engagement.

1. Committee formation:

To celebrate the week-long programme in a befitting manner, the District Magistrate shall lead the initiatives and engage each stake holders to ensure smooth and successful implementation of the week-long programme. Additional District Magistrate (Education), all district and sub district level education officers will leave no stone unturned to ensure its success.

2. Tentative Schedule :

- Cleaning & sanitation of Schools/ SSK/MSK/ Colleges/ Educational Institutions/ Universities to be done by 31.12.2025.
- This week-long programme at the School, College, and University level will be held from 01.01.2026 to 08.01.2026. The programme will be tentatively for 2 hours each day (preferably from 11.00 am to 1.00 pm or as per convenience of the authority of the educational institution).
- The programme on 01.01.2026 may be decided by the school authority.
- At school level, on the first day, the Head of the Institution (HoI) may conduct the assembly in open air or in the Assembly Hall. The HoI will extend his acknowledgment and best wishes to the students on successfully graduating to their new classes. She/ He shall also brief the students in general, about the heritage of the school, and of the week-long celebration ahead and discuss about the different policies and activities of SED.
- Assembly will start with the State song and the HoI will take the opportunity to highlight any noteworthy accomplishments of students either in the school or beyond.
- In respective classes, the teachers will deliver the tentative schedule of week-long celebration and introduction of the class specific new activities which is to be implemented. She/He shall also speak importance of maintenance of personal hygiene, sanitization, hand washing, need for empathy and how to engage with peers.
- The *Shubhechcha Barta* of Hon'ble Chief Minister along-with school Text Books and *khatas* will be distributed among students.
- PTM shall be preferably held on the 1st day of school, discussing the week-long schedule of Students' Week celebration and specifically the introduction of new policies of SED.
- On the other days of the week, there may be an interactive session, intra school events and cultural activities by the students and teachers. Different activities as given below may be planned throughout the week by the HOI and the Nodal Teacher designated for observation of Students' week.

- Each day the programme may conclude with singing of the National Anthem by both students and the Teachers.
- At College / University level, similar programme as enlisted below shall be held as determined by the appropriate authority of the said College / University/ Educational Institute.

3. Programmes at different Levels:

i) School/ SSK/MSK Level

A. Elementary :

The Students' Week may be celebrated with the following activities:

a. Distribution Initiatives:

- *Shubhecha Barta* from the Hon'ble Chief Minister to students.
- Certificates and mark sheets during graduation ceremonies.
- Textbooks and notebooks (*Khatas*) to guardians.
- Braille and large print books for CWSN (Children With Special Needs) students in need.

b. Guardian Engagement:

- Mega PTM with guardians to discuss various components of school, i.e. Book Corner, Wall Magazine, TLM, print rich classroom (with children's work), kitchen garden, role of Sishu Sanshad, ongoing school activities, strategies to enhance students' reading habits, and ways to facilitate home-based learning. After the discussion, FLN related games may be conducted for parents.
- During the discussion guardians will be made aware on safety and security of the students. They will be intimated on Early Warning System, social issues like early marriage, child abuse(both substance and sexual) and mental health issues.
- Parents/ local experts in the field like Drawing, Handicrafts, Storytelling, can be invited to guide and interact with students.

c. Community and Environmental Activities:

- o Organizing cleanliness drives in schools and community
- o Planting saplings and conducting nature studies

d. Educational and Co-Curricular Activities:

- o Competitions: Reading, writing, math, storytelling
- o Co-curricular: Poster making, debates, elocution, STEM exhibitions, and quizzes
- o Story making by students and Role Play
- o Workshops for teachers and students
- o Exposure visits
- o Food festivals
- o TLM (Teaching-Learning Material) creation by teachers and Demonstration

e. Life Skills Enhancement:

- o Sessions on life skills education focusing on 10 core skills using AVs
- o Poster making and essay writing on 10 core life skills
- o Poster making, slogan writing, essay writing to promote patriotism and values

f. Showcasing Creativity and Resources:

- o Display of students' works and artifacts
- o Exhibition of Projects done by students
- o Display of IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) materials as approved by State/District authorities within the school premises

g. Special Enrolment Drives:

- o Door-to-door visits by para-teachers, special educators, or SSK/MSK teachers to reach out to age-specific children in the locality and encourage enrolment

These activities aim to make the celebration inclusive, engaging, and impactful for all stakeholders involved.

B. Secondary & Higher Secondary:

The week-long activities may focus on facilitating **Student Credit Card Camps, Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Camps, holding of Mega PTMs, career orientation** along with the following initiatives:

a. Distribution and Awareness Activities:

- Distribution of *Shubhecha Barta* from the Hon'ble Chief Minister to students.
- Distribution of certificates and mark sheets during graduation ceremonies.
- Distribution of free textbooks and notebooks (*Khatas*) to students.
- Provision of Braille and large-print books to CWSN (Children with Special Needs).
- Display of IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) materials as approved by the State/District authorities.
- Awareness on school health, vector borne diseases, anti tobacco campaign, drug abuse and other social issues
- Awareness on "Passport to Earning" (P2E) course on digital literacy with AI, financial literacy, generic earning skills and job specific skills

b. School-based Competitions:

- Reading, writing, math, and storytelling.

c. Workshops:

- Sessions for both teachers and students

d. Creative and Co-Curricular Activities:

- Slogan writing, comic creation, poster making
- Planting saplings, nature studies, and STEM exhibitions
- Debates, elocution, and quizzes
- Food festivals

e. Innovative Activities:

- TLM (Teaching-Learning Material) preparation by teachers and students
- Exhibition of TLM (Teaching-Learning Material)

f. Career Guidance Day:

- Reviewing the Career Portal and organizing talks and discussions with eminent personalities and professionals from local industries

- Creation of Career Corners in school
- Orientation of parents on various initiatives related to career guidance, i.e. career cards, career workbook and Career Portal
- g. **Life Skills Education:**
 - Sessions including poster making, creating emotion chart, debates, and empathy storytelling on 10 core life skills (Name of 10 Life Skills may be included)
 - Poster making, slogan writing, essay writing to promote patriotism and values
 - Orientation of parents on various initiatives related to life skills
- h. **“Meet the Icon” Program:**
 - Inviting renowned local icons to interact with students.
- i. **Enrolment and Scholarship Drives**

Organizing awareness and help desks for

 - Student Credit Card Scheme.
 - Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship (SVMCM).
 - Aikyashree, Pre-Matric, and Post-Matric Scholarships.
 - Registration, updating, and renewal of **Kanyashree beneficiaries** in the Kanyashree portal
 - Door-to-door visits by *Shikha Bandhus* to enrol Out-of-School Children (OOSC)
- j. **Community and Health Initiatives:**
 - Awareness campaigns by students on preventing child marriages, violation of child rights (Child Abuse and Trafficking), importance of school education, school health, preventing drug abuse, anti tobacco campaign, safety security of the students, dengue etc.
 - Conducting health camps for students and the community

These activities aim to engage students, guardians, and the community while promoting awareness, skill development, and inclusive educational practices.

ii) **College and University Level:**

Students' week would be observed in all Govt. and Govt. Aided colleges / Universities / Educational Institutions including Technical/ Professional Institutions of the State, in line with the spirit of the programme specially focussing on the facilitation of **Student Credit Card camps and other activities like:**

- Conducting online seminar / workshop and dissemination of information regarding **Student Welfare schemes and other pertinent issues**
- **Organizing Student Credit Card awareness camp cum help desk**
- Organizing awareness camp cum help desk for SVMCM, Aikyashree and **Post Metric Scholarship**
- Organizing Health Check-up camps and psychological counselling
- Display of IEC materials as determined by competent authority of the State/ District
- Organizing drawing / poster competition
- Quiz Competition
- Cultural programmes like singing competition, recitation competition, creative writing competition.
- Organizing Career Counselling sessions
- Holding seminars on Digital Education or blend mode of education with emphasis on students' participation
- Interaction with the guardians may be planned on 2nd or 3rd January, 2026.
- Interactive exposure visits by School students of Secondary/ Higher secondary classes to different Colleges/ Universities (concerned HOIs may plan in consultation with schools in their catchment areas)

iii) **District Level:**

The programme at District HQ may plan activities mentioned below for the whole week. The activities taken up during the week may include as follows:

- Organize *Prabhat Pheri*
- Publicity/Awareness regarding the new activities implemented by SED at school level
- Setting up awareness desks on Student Credit Card at the offices of BDOs / SDOs / DM and Local bodies
- Organizing cultural programmes like recitation, reading activities, dance, drama, music, solo act by students and teachers of few selected schools.
- Organizing Book Fair
- Organizing Science exhibitions

- Organizing Career Fair
- Organizing Stress management workshops / awareness camp for students during the week
- Awareness programmes

4. Monitoring:

The Students' Week intervention will be monitored by the District level Committees and school wise data will be submitted on a Google Sheet format shared by the State. The District Education Officer, SSM will be overall in-charge of updating the Google Sheet on a daily basis with the help of DIS Primary and DIS Secondary.

5. Fund Provision:

For conducting the programme at school level, the expenditure may be borne out of available fund of SSA.

For College and University level celebration, expenditure to be borne out of available funds at their end.
